AFFORDABLE HOUSING

The LWVHC's role is to be a member of the Affordable Housing Coalition, which meets on a regular basis throughout the year. This allows us to be supportive and participatory in the goal for affordable housing in Henderson County. To this end we jointly sponsored a Forum in March of 2011 that was very well attended.

DEMOCRACY AGENDA

Democracy Agenda focuses on legislative monitoring and promoting League "action alerts". Topics of interest include ethics, lobbying reform, campaign financing, taxes, redistricting, election laws, and various tax issues. N.C's passage of public financing of elections of judges was due in large part to the hard work of many Leagues across this state.

DIVERSITY IN ACTION

The LWVHC supports representative decision-making at all levels of government by encouraging diversity with regard to age, sex, ethnicity, race, socio-economics, education, and sexual orientation. Our Diversity Dialogue group shares perspectives, fosters understanding, and suggests steps to improve community relationships. The LWVHC works to achieve diversity in its membership which reflects our entire community.

FINANCE and FUNDRAISING

Members of this group assist the Board in developing creative ways to raise funds necessary to carry out LWVHC's programs for the year and keep dues as low as possible. Last year our single largest source of income resulted from a direct mail fundraising campaign. Ongoing fundraising activities include the successful annual flower bulb sale along with sales of "LWV - NOT for Women Only" buttons and note cards.

HEALTHCARE ROUNDTABLE

The focus of this statewide group is to educate and inform the community on the Affordable Care Act of 2010. Several members have been trained as Community Application Counselors in an effort to facilitate the enrollment of individuals in the online marketplace exchange. Collaboration with various community stakeholders broadens the effort.

IMMIGRATION

This local committee was generated in response to the League's National Study on Immigration in 2007-2008 and has developed a program used to educate new League members and the general public. The committee also monitors legislative proposals related to immigration, communicates with legislators, and encourages advocacy to support the national League's position.

JUDICIAL ADVOCACY

The LWVHC helped influence the successful addition of a second day a month for Juvenile Court in Henderson County through its collaboration with the District Attorney. In addition to advocating for a Family Court, members of the Judicial Advocacy Committee participate in related group/commission meetings and collaborate with strategic people in the courts to improve the juvenile justice system.

KIDS VOTING

This program was initiated by the LWVHC in 2004 in conjunction with Kids Voting North Carolina. It seeks to help students learn about voting and to involve their parents or guardians in the voting process. Students may vote at school, online, or at a precinct polling location. A civics education program is available for use in the classroom, at the Boys and Girls Club, and Home Schoolers' Association.

MEDIA and BULLETIN MANAGEMENT

Members arrange for photography, distribute "Know Your Government" booklets, coordinate media publicity, maintain a file of newspaper articles on the LWVHC, and manage the website. This group also receives and generates articles and photos, develops layout, edits, and distributes via email the LWVHC monthly BULLETIN, the primary means of keeping active and prospective members informed.
